3. Reserve right to reject any ad
4. Submit ads in Word (.doc) format
5. Color is available in on-line (Web) version, but printed copies are only black and white
6. Newsletter is to be mailed and posted on or by the 10th of each month. If unable to do so, then the advertiser will be notified and given a choice to run or not
